Dear Mr. Wood:

This letter concerns Moor Green, a historical house you own that is listed on the State and National Registers.

As you may know, a comprehensive historical sites survey is being conducted in Prince William County. During the course of the survey, our architectural historian recently visited Moor Green, and last Tuesday night reported to the Historical Commission that the house is vacant, open, and is subject to vandalism. In interviews with neighbors and residents, our surveyor learned that you may have abandoned your plans to elaborately restore the house and take up residence in it. Naturally the residents of Moor Green Estates are concerned about the present state of the house, ^{and} ~~because~~ many of them may have bought into the subdivision because of the manor house.

The Prince William County Historical Commission is also concerned about Moor Green's welfare because it is the Commission's responsibility to ensure and foster the preservation and protection of a large part of the County's cultural resources. Moor Green, it should be noted, is considered by this Commission to have outstanding historical and architectural value, and it is for that reason that the Commission elected to award it the County's historical plaque. Only about 30 sites and structures in the County have been awarded this plaque.

The Historical Commission would like to offer its assistance in preserving Moor Green and would appreciate the opportunity to discuss with you the problems of this important landmark.
