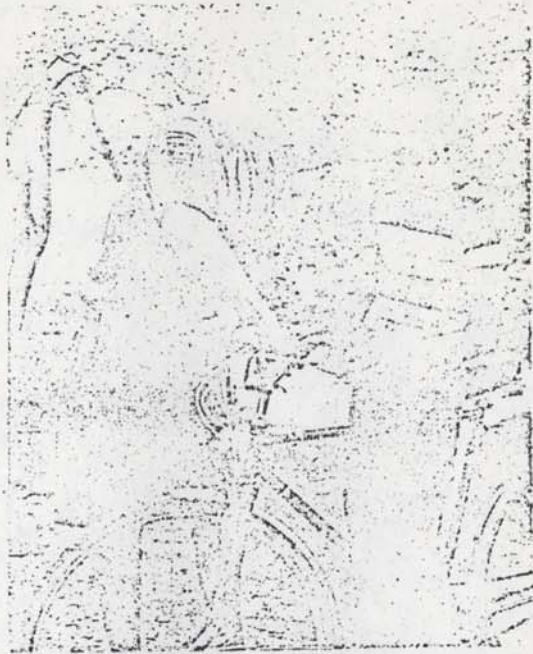

Troop 1392 bikes leg of canal in Maryland

Boy Scout Troop 1392 of Dale City recently biked the Cumberland - Hancock, Maryland leg of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal. Fourteen Scouts and two adults completed the 60 miles in less than 12 hours riding time.

The flying vanguard comprised of Randy Anthony, Rod Endert, Rick Endeet and Dwight Crone. In the main element were Doug Crone, Greg Bartolett, Nick Naclerio, Jimmy Bartlett, Scoutmaster Jim Mason, Rick Lovett, Albert Delascassas, Stewart Mitchell and Ken Ahern. Scoutmaster Walter Crone, Jamie Griffin and Benson Peltzer were the rear party.

Twenty-four miles went underwheel before evening and included short rests. At each stop, mud was scraped and mechanical adjustments

were made with the help of tools and know-how from the rear party.

The run ended near the 115 year old Paw Paw tunnel, where the boys ate Scoutmastees' slugullion and camped over. The Scouts visited various landmarks along the way picking up candy and snacks.

Eleven miles northeast up the towpath, beyond BSA Camp Strauss, the boys rolled in for lunch and a rest before the last six miles.

Tonoloway creek Lock at Hancock was reached by afternoon on Sunday with trailers waiting to load the packs and bikes and the troop was on the road home.

The trip provided much exercise for all as well as permitting the boys to visit some of the historical places along the way.

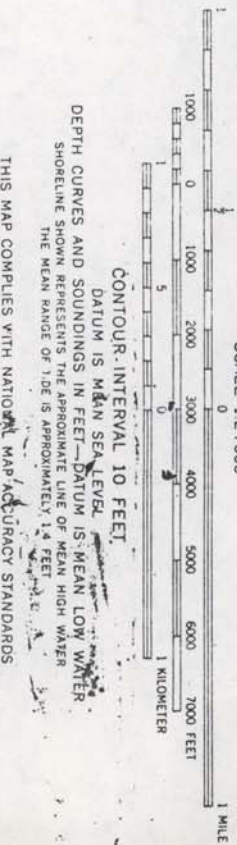
