A two-story, frame-constructed late 19th or early 20th century former residence, this building is now the center section of the Occoquan Inn. It has a metal-covered shed roof, a moulded, dentiled, and bracketed cornice, and a plain, wide frieze. It is covered with wide wooden siding painted light brown. There are cornerboards. The three-bay front has $^2/2$ sliding sash windows, shuttered, and with plain wide box trim. The front door is a moulded, paneled door, one tier of two rounded-arch panels over a tier of two panels. There is a shedroofed open porch across the front supported by plain square columns.

Interior inspected?

Historical significance (Chain of title; individuals, families, events, etc., associated with the property.)

Located on the north side of Mill Street, this former residence, built at the turn of the century, is now part of the Occoquan inn. A restaurant has been located here since about 1968. Prior to that, the property was owned by R.S. Hall. In about 1954, the structure was a residence owned by Theresa Davis, who had inherited the property at about that time.


The building was damaged during the flood caused by Hurricane Agnes in 1972.




