Ron Turner provided the following information on The Hotel Alton in Occoquan (December 2007)

The **Hotel Alton** was operated by the Lycurgus Ledman and other members of the Ledman family from what appears to be the mid 1870's to at least 1910. The bar-room at the hotel apparently closed in 1904 or at least no one purchased a liquor license after 1903. The old hotel was one of the casualties of the great Occoquan fire of 1916.
