HOUSE RECOGNIZED. Dean and Gail Neiderhoffer stand outside Park Gate, their historic Nokesville home Saturday after a plaque for the house was dedicated by the Elizabeth McIntosh Hammill Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution. The house, built between 1735-1750, is where Colonel Thomas Lee, eldest son of Richard Henry Lee, signer of the Declaration of Independence, lived from 1790-1805 with his wife Mildred Washington, niece of George Washington. Park Gate is registered with the Prince William County Historical Society, the Virginia State Register of Historic Places, the National Register of Historic Places and the National Park Service's Historic American Buildings Inventory.
