Located in a small, approximately 40-foot-square enclosure surrounded by a wire fence, the Pattie Cemetery is on the east side of S.R. 705, a few hundred yards southeast of the old Pattie House, a frame residence constructed in about 1900.

Interior inspected? N/A

Historical significance (Chain of title; individuals, families, events, etc., associated with the property.)

The old Pattie Cemetery may not be officially reserved in the recent deed transfer for the sale of the surrounding property by H.G. Simpson, the most recent owner.

The Pattie family after whom the cemetery is known came from Fredericksburg and owned farms in the western Prince William area during the mid-to-late 19th, and early into the 20th centuries.

There are about 15 burials in the small fenced enclosure. The earliest graves, those of the Blackwells, date to just after the Civil War and are marked with only fieldstones. Engraved markers exist for the Patties, however, including Benjamine F. (1818-1902), Luther B. (1851-1927), and Harriett R. (8160-1931).


The old Pattie House (c1900) is northwest of the cemetery.
