
Dear Mr. Schofield:

I enclose for you Xerox copies of the courthouse sketches that were found at Gunston Hall this past summer. I also enclose a scale copy on graph paper of the doodles which show their relationship & correct size. I am also sending you a plate from the English architect, Robert Morris' Architectural Remembrances, which closely resembles the lower right hand elevation from Gunston. I have explained my ideas about the significance and meaning of these sketches in a letter to Mrs. Lorraine Dow, Chairman of the Historical Commission.

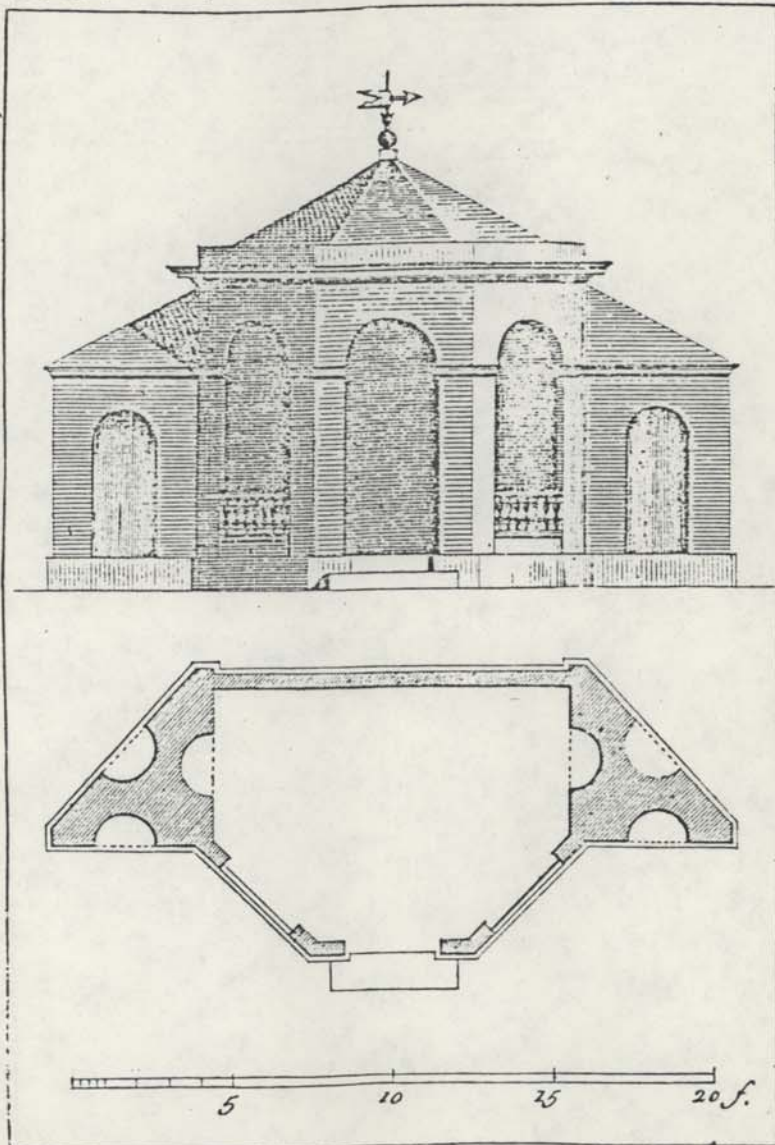
