

1. SUBJECT:

"Ranch House".

2. LOCATION:

To the west of private road leading from Route #621. $3\frac{1}{4}$ miles Route #211.

3. DATE:

Unknown.

4. OWNERS:

Originally a grant from the Proprietors of the Northern Ne to George Carter, the 29th of June, 1731, of two thousand forty-one acres, being part of a larger grant containing fone thousand, six hundred and sixty acres granted to Landc Carter, George Carter, Robert Burwell, Mann Page and Carter There seems to be no way of finding when the division of t land was made, but for many years it belonged to the "Mour View" tract, which land adjoins, and is now owned by Mr. . R. Hynton.

5. DESCRIPTION:

At present this old house is nestling in the midst of a lafield, with no trees near by, but there must have been transurrounding it in the past as the stumps in the space arouthe house will testify. It is located about four hundred from the road, and has not been used as a dwelling for manyears.

The interesting thing about it is the form in which it was built, being a double cabin with a covered span between that a large team could pass through. There is one chimne and there seems to have been no way of heating the cabin is to the north.

It is in such a ruinous condition that it is difficult to describe it. The logs are all mortised, and were former daubed with stone and brick, mud chinked. There is one la room in each cabin, and a loft reached by a ladder, the sain both parts of the house. There was once a large stone place, and wide hearth, but it is torn apart, and the child partly fallen. There are the rotting remains of sever outbuildings, and the yard is dotted with clumps of matrix vine and rose bushes.

6. HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE:

No one seems to know the history of this house, but it i locally known as "Ranch House", although there is no expl

tion of the name. Some thirty years ago it was habitable and a family lived there for some time. but it is almost beyond repair at the present time. There was some fighting here in 1861, and there was said have been at least one soldier shot while hiding by some these buildings.
