This house is unusual, in part, because of the location and size of its 4 x 4 side sliding 2d story windows. Several other 1½ to 2-story log houses in this vicinity are constructed similarly, without dormers.

This may be a central-chimney log house or two sections, one log and one frame, joined, with a chimney between them. In other words, the house, with its separate entrances, could have been a duplex.

Windows on 1st floor are 6/6 double-hung sash. Windows on 2d floor front and back, instead of dormers. Windows, 2d floor, 6/6 double hung sash on gable ends, and 4 x 4 side sliding sash on front. 6-pane, single (stationary or hinged at top) windows on back of main house and side of el.

Siding is wide (5" to 8"-lap) weatherboarding painted white except where unpainted. Whitewashed logs with mud chinking on front right, and board and batten vertical siding on front left.

Chimneys: both brick, one (stove chimney) pierces roof of el, the other (fireplace stack) at center of main house. Both either repaired or replacements.

There are two small outbuildings adjacent to rear of house, and lined up along driveway. One has a gable roof and wooden shingles; the other a shed roof with wooden shingles and a brick stove chimney. Both have board and batten siding.

Interior inspected? No.

Historical significance (Chain of title; individuals, families, events, etc., associated with the property.)

House is located south of the entrance to Edge Hill and Dunblane, q.v., and beside Ewell's, or Grace Chapel. Identified on 1901 County map as the Gardner property.

Present tenants: Margaret Rhodes, Ronnie G. Willis (names on mail box.)

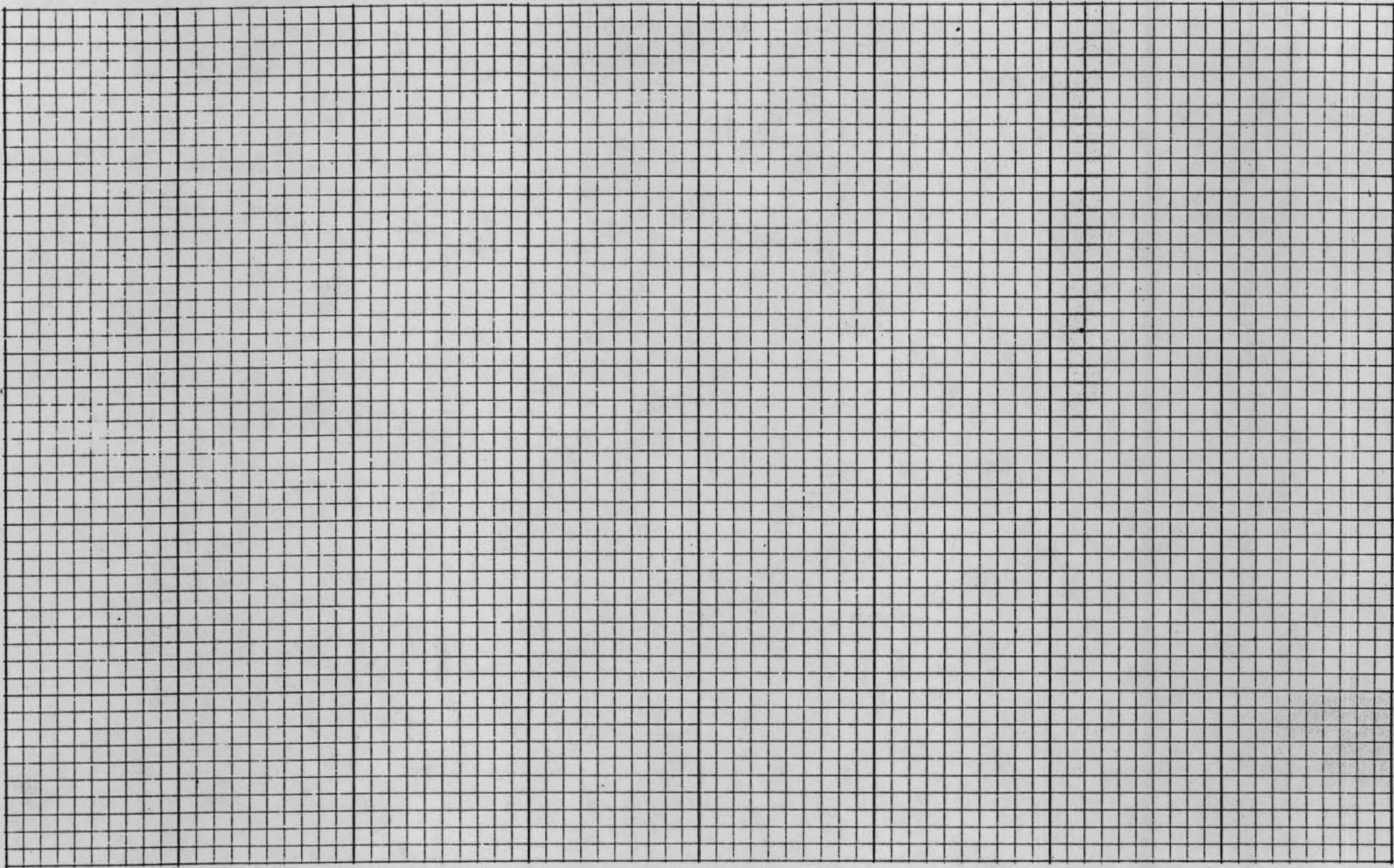

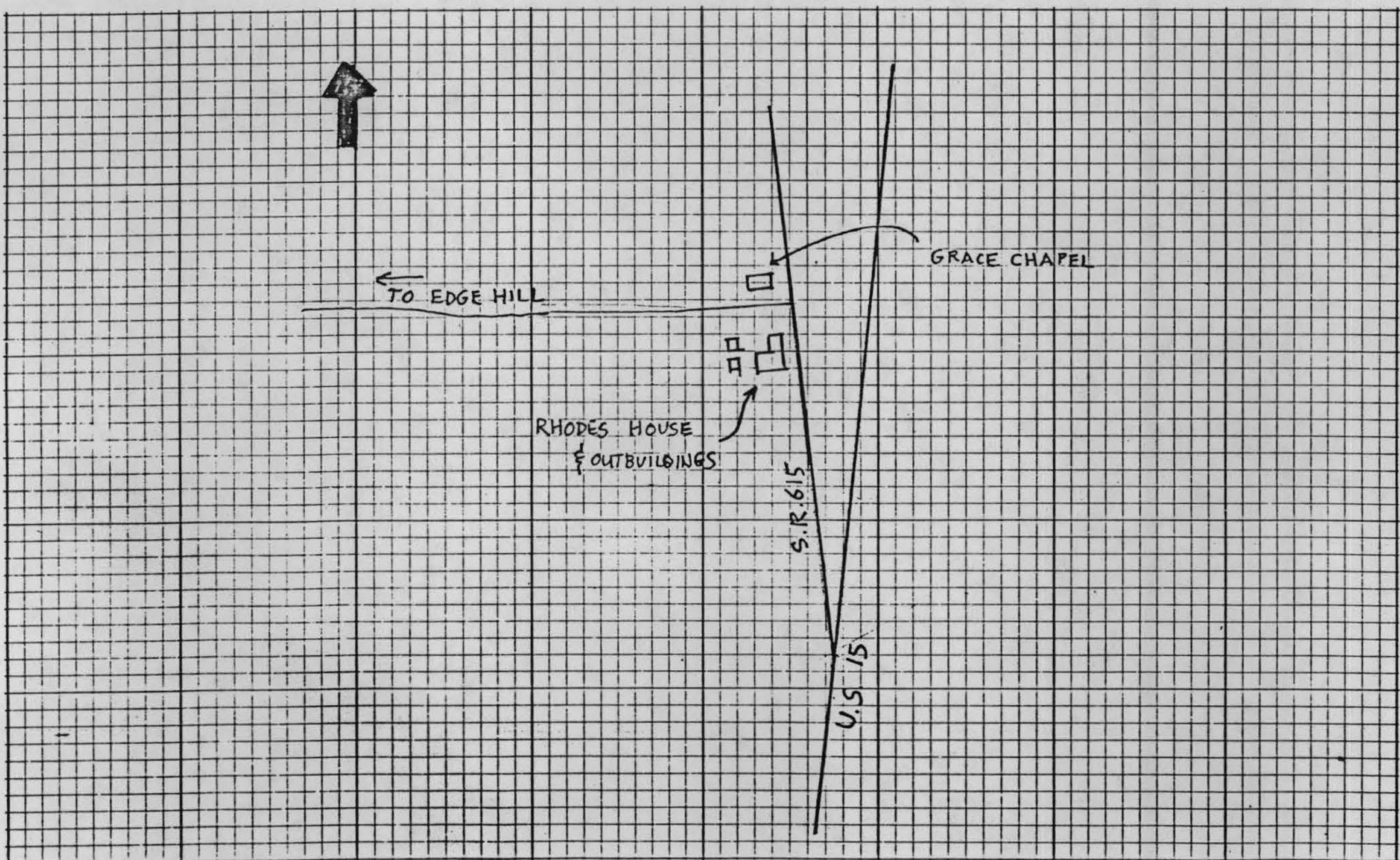

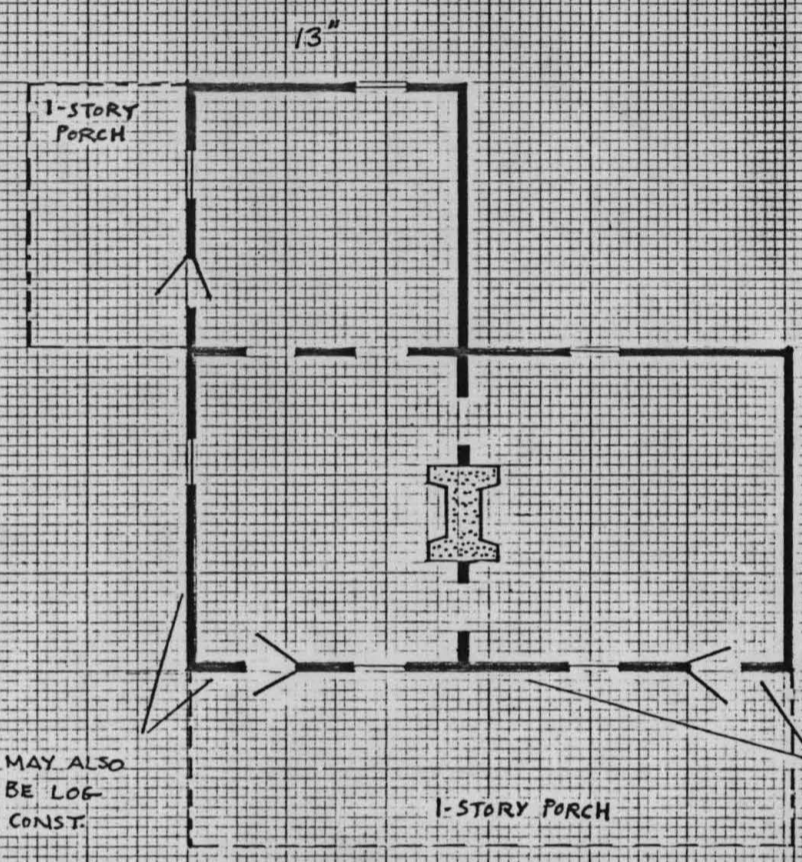
