A one-story, frame-built, stucco-covered traditional style church with the main entrance in the gable end; a bell tower and steeple; and tracery-design gothic arch windows. The semi-circular window in the bell tower lights the choir loft. Lumber and window frames from the earlier, 1914, church went into this construction.

The church received a one-story addition to the rear in 1977. Beside the church is a small cemetery.

Interior inspected? No.

Historical significance (Chain of title; individuals, families, events, etc., associated with the property.)

The first Sacred Heart Catholic Church was a small frame church constructed in 1914 at Minnieville on Old Shop Road and Spriggs Road, between Smithfield School and Posey's Store. Father William Jan was the priest and the church's builder. The land was donated by Joseph Cheslock. The early membership rolls included parishoners of the Byzantine Rite who later constructed a Byzantine Church (St. Mary's 76-282) on Hoadly Road.

In 1937 the church was dismantled and re-erected, in part, on land donated by Mary Sholtis. The Minnieville cemetery is located near the site of the earlier church and contains the graves of some of the church's founders, many of whom emigrated to this area from Eastern European countries.

Sacred Heart is a Mission Church of the Holy Family Catholic Church in Dale City, though prior to 1970, All Saints Church in Manassas had responsibility for Sacred Heart Mission.




