Word has been received in Manassas of the death of a former resident who was well known in the area. Mrs. Orbun V. (Hazel) Powell died in Fort Myers, Fla., where she and her husband had lived for the past three years since moving from Manassas.

→ They lived on Signal Hill Farm, Manassas, for nearly twenty years. Before selling their farm, the Powells specified in the deed that Signal Hill must be set aside as a permanent monument to honor those who died during the Civil War. On April 15, 1974, the town of Manassas Park purchased the property thereby making possible the preservation of the site for future generations.

Mrs. Powell, while residing in Manassas, served as chairman of the auxiliary of Southern States Cooperative and was active in school and church work. From 1966 to 1968, the Powells served as U.S. Department of State representatives in Asuncion, Paraguay. After Mr. Powell's retirement, they traveled in Mexico and Canada. Besides her husband, Mrs. Powell is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Margo Harrell, of Salt Lake City; a son, Julian A. of Greenville, N.C., and two grandchildren.

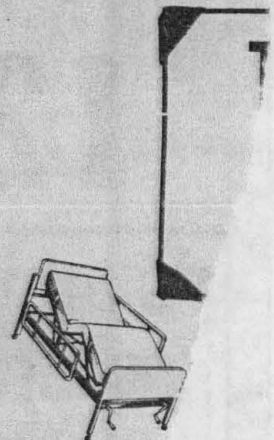
