# MILL BRANCH (trib. of Occoquan Creek)

## 33. PRIEST'S MILL (PEAK'S OR PEAKE'S MILL)

Built before 1735 and acquired then by John Peake. Merchant flour mill, operated until early 1900's. Destroyed before 1930's. Was s.w. of Ravenwood.

## OCCOQUAN CREEK (River, Run)

### 34. COUNTRY MILL (JANNEY'S MILL)

Built c. 1757 by John Ballendire. There were 2 mills previously on this tract which Ballendine acquired from Valentine Peyton in 1755. Merchant flour mill later owned by Janney family. Stood until 1890. At Occoquan.

#### 35. MERCHANTS' MILL

Built c. 1759 by John Ballendine. Passed to John Semple, then Nathaniel Ellicott, then E. & A. Janney. Merchant flour mill. Owned jointly by merchants of Alexandria and Dumfries, hence its name. One of first mills in U. S. to have installed "automated flour mill" patented by Oliver Evans of Philadelphia, which was perfected in 1795. Burned in 1924. Just west of Country Mill.

#### 36. COTTON MILL

Built 1828, bought by Occoquan Mfg. Co. 1837. Cotton textile mill, one of first in South. Burned during Civil War (1864?).

#### 37. IRON FOUNDRY

Built c. 1755 by John Ballendine, probably on site of earlier water-powered forge. Ballendine was partner with John Tayloe and Presley Thornton of the Neabsco Works, but ceased to have an interest after 1765.

Probably abandoned by John Semple at that time or later.

38. SINCLAIR'S (MADDOX'S) MILL
W, B.

Before 1820, when marked as Maddox Mill. Owned by Sinclair family in late 1800's and by G. W. Bell in early 1900's. Dismantled. Custom grist mill, approx. 1 m. below confluence of Broad and Cedar Runs, on present Lake Jackson.

Possibly same as Jelkins Mill, Deed from James William & Chlor Reley [of Jefferson 6 Ya] to Thomas Doodwin, 15 May 1840, conveying 200 acres, mentions Felkins mill race as a boundary, along with lands of Israel Farrow deceased & Capit. Dwatkins deceased, 1841 tax list shows property to be 3 mi. SE of the court house (Brentsville). [PWC Deeds 14:72] DM on Ecdar Run
