painted black or stained dark.

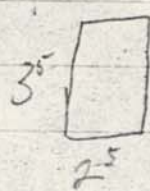
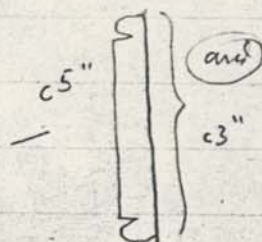
